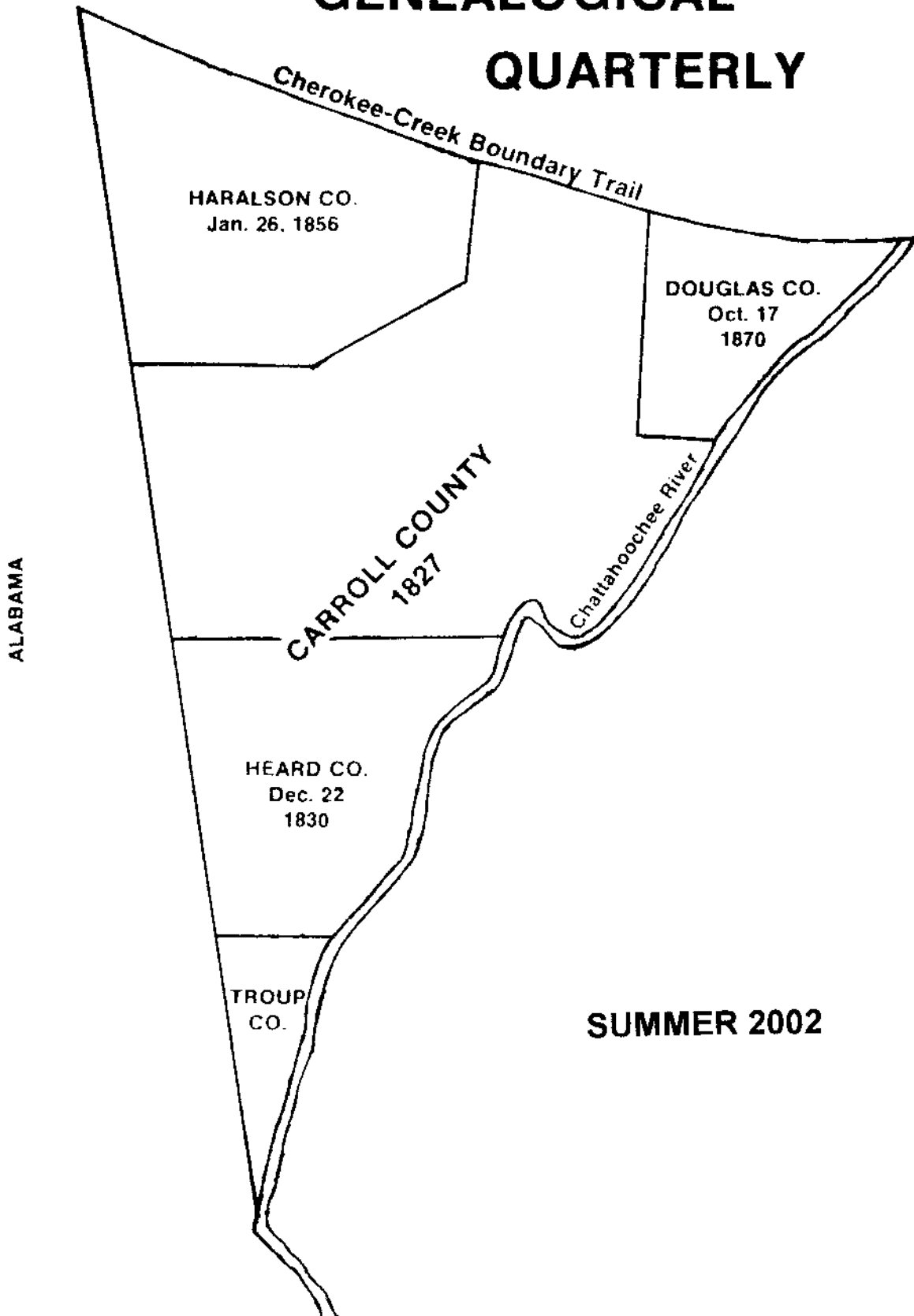

We have been busy adding books to the Special Collections Room at the Neva Lomason Library in the past months. As stated previously, our focus is to collect as many Georgia items that will help people search for their ancestors who came to Carroll County. Of course many who come to the Library are searching for ancestors in other areas. We want to build the information available for tracing ancestors and most of the ancestors came south from Maryland and Virginia through North and South Carolina into eastern Georgia. Our newspaper volumes cover the antebellum period before Carroll County had a newspaper for public or personal information. Recent additions are listed on the next page of this Quarterly.

The annual workshop is planned for the fall but it has not been finalized at this time. Our plan is to focus on North Carolina information sources. The notice of the workshop will be in the next Quarterly.

Mary Florence Word and Ruth McNinch have completed indexing the first five years of the Quarterlies. Because those who have these earlier Quarterlies have already done their research, we do not expect a high demand for copies except from libraries having early editions. 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THE FAMILY OF SAMUEL THOMAS JONES & NANCY JANE ORA WRIGHT

Samuel Thomas Jones, the seventh child of Stephen Thomas Jones (See Spring 2002 Quarterly), was born 19 Feb 1855, Carroll Co, GA. He married 07 Aug 1873, Carroll Co, GA, to Nancy Jane Ora Wright, who was born 20 Nov 1850, Bowdon, Carroll Co, GA, to William Asa Wright and Louisa "Lucy" Smith. She died 30 Jan 1925, Cullman Co, AL, and is buried in the Fellowship Cem., Cullman, AL. He died 27 Dec 1934, Cullman Co, AL, and is buried in Cullman Co, AL. They had 10 children: Asa Andrew, Lucy, Melissa Elizabeth, William Stephen, Henry Thomas, James Fletcher, Miles Ammon, Nancy Jane, Mary Virginia, and Emmett Luford Jones.

Asa Andrew Jones had cousins in Cleburne Co, AL, according to his son Ervin Clarence Jones. Sometime after the birth of Aunt Lucy Myrtle Jones, 19 Oct 1896, Asa Andrew and Martha Naomi Clay King Jones moved to LA. Grandpa liked it there but Grandma became sick with malaria and they moved to Cullman Co, AL, where Grandma's parents, William Carter and Frances Burt King were living. Grandma and Aunt Lucy made the trip by train, but Grandpa and his uncle, Abraham Lincoln Wright, traveled by wagon bringing the household things. They arrived in Cullman shortly before the birth of their second child, William Otis Jones, born 16 Dec 1896. They slept wherever they could on the trip -- in barns, or homes -- fixing clocks, sewing machines, and whatever needed fixing to pay for the hospitality they received. Grandpa would laugh about having to move fast if something they had repaired stopped working before they were out of the area. I do not remember hearing how long the trip took. Asa Andrew Jones and Martha were living in Tallapoosa, Haralson Co, GA, when they decided to leave GA to live in LA. In 1926 Andrew bought a brand new Overland touring car. In 1937 he and Martha (second wife) and sons Woodrow, Buehl, and Ervin drove to New York City to visit the older boys and families who were living there. On the way home they came by way of Rome, GA, to visit Martha's sisters living there. When it rained everyone had to help put up the isinglass curtains. When the rain stopped it was steamy hot in the car and they all had to get out and take down the curtains.

MT. ZION, CARROLL COUNTY, GEORGIA

The area that became Carroll County and Mount Zion originally was occupied by native people called "Indians." (They mistakenly were called "Indians" by Europeans who thought that Columbus had discovered India in 1492.) These natives came across a land bridge between Siberia and Alaska. For thousands of years, they wandered all over North and South America.

As the climate changed and the big game became scarce, the Indians began to settle down in permanent "towns." In the sixteenth century, a warlike group came from the west and began conquering the Indians in Alabama and Georgia. These people were called Muskogees. The English explorers and traders called them "Creeks" because of where they were first encountered on Ocheese Creek (near Indian Springs). Some of the explorers and traders married Indian women and produced a large number of mixed bloods. Some of the mixed bloods became quite prominent. One such was William McIntosh (Tustanuggee Hutkee - White Warrior). His father was a British officer who married a Creek woman named Senoya. McIntosh was a first cousin to Georgia Governor George M. Troup.

William McIntosh became very prominent in the Creek Confederation. He was first mentioned in the Treaty of New York in the 1790's. He quickly became a sub chief, a major chief, Brigadier General in the U.S. Army, plantation owner, innkeeper, Indian trader, and postmaster. About 1811, he located his headquarters at the "Upper Ferry" on the Chattahoochee River, which he called "Acorn Bluff." In 1825, the Upper Creeks (from Alabama), under Menawa, assassinated him at his plantation for selling the remainder of the Creek land in Georgia.

As the Creeks began to leave Georgia, Governor Troup sent surveyors into what is now Carroll County and they began to lay off land districts and land lots. Mount Zion is located in land districts 7, 9, and 10. The land was advertised in newspapers and people from all over the United States purchased tickets for the 1827 land lottery. Soon those who had the lucky draws began to move in and settle Carroll County.

Settlers moved into the Mount Zion area as early as 1827, but most moved on to Alabama, Mississippi, and Texas. The first permanent settler was Hicks Martin and his family. Martin was born in York District, SC, and later moved to Forsyth County, Georgia, where he married Margaret Casey. In the 1840's, he moved to Cherokee County. In the fall of 1852, he moved to Carroll County. Hicks Martin and his family began to clear up the land, built a two-story log house and farmed his 202.5 acres. The site of the original Martin house is now occupied by the home of Mrs. Buena McLain.

Martin was a remarkable man for his day. He was a farmer, a Methodist minister, a medical doctor, a pharmacist, and a church and school founder. He was the head of a large family whose children grew up to become doctors, ministers, teachers, developers, postmasters, etc. One of his grandsons, J. Roy Martin, was one of the oldest Peace Corps volunteers from Georgia.

Other settlers began to move into the Mount Zion area. Among the early Mt. Zion family names were Alexander, Austin, Bryan, Bagwell, Bevis, Burrow, Chaney, Crawford, Davenport, Finley, Fielder, Harrison, Ingram, McBurnett, McCalman, McRea, McPherson, Morrison, Posey, Price, Proctor, Reid, Roberson, Smith, Thompson,

Mt. Zion, Cont'd.

Trimble, Walker, and Windom.

After building their homes, the settlers started churches in the area. Some of these churches were Bethel, Lenity, Mt. Pleasant, Mt. Zion, New Hope, New Salem, Old Harmony, Pinetuckey, Ramah, Shiloh, and Union. Later Bethrl, Shiloh, and Union Campgrounds were established.

When the settlers needed flour, meal, and grits, to have lumber sawed, and to have cotton ginned, they visited the watermills operated by Bryan and Davenport, Leak and Putnam, Entrekin, Trimble and Robertson. Trimble and Robertson also operated a tan-yard.

As the area began to be settled, enterprising young men began to operate general stores, as well as to farm. Some of these stores in Mt. Zion were operated by James M. Savitz, Entrekin and Shaw, W. T. Morris, H. H. Morris, Fowler and Landers, D. P. Holmes, Gammon Brothers, Aubrey Martin and Pope Garrett. Nearby stores were operated by J. G. Robertson and Floyd Harris (at Jake), J. B. Moore (at Plowshare), and George J. Creel (near Eureka Baptist Church).

In the early days of the Mt. Zion area, medical doctors made house calls and charged from twenty-five cents to two dollars for their services. Medicines made by the doctors were extra. Some Mt. Zion area doctors were Hicks Martin, James A. Martin, William H. Malone, James Rogers, and a bogus doctor named Lewis.

The earliest post office in the Mt. Zion area was called Loyal and probably was operated in the Trimble-Robertson Mill. The postmaster was Bell Trimble Robertson. A few years later, the name was changed to Turkey Creek Mills and was located in Joseph Entrekin's mill. Joseph Entrekin was postmaster at that time. In 1875, the name was changed to Mt. Zion (after the church) and that post office continues today. Since 1875, the post office of Mt. Zion has been located in various places. Some of the postmasters were Belle Trimble Robertson Morris, J. W. B. Pharr, Mamie Holmes, Edna Clark, Alton Smith, and Opal Stokes. The present postmaster is Opal Newman.

Mt. Zion Methodist Episcopal Church (North) was founded in April of 1865 by Hicks Martin and ten other couples. The first conference preacher was John Murphy (1812-1897). The present Mt. Zion pastor is Hammett Evans. The first church buildings for the Mt. Zion Church were a brush arbor and a log building. The present sanctuary was built in 1889 with additions made in 1944 and in the 1950's. The first parsonage for the Church was built in 1889 and was used until 1953, when the present parsonage was built.

In 1876, Rev. James Mitchell (Presiding Elder of Carroll Circuit, Atlanta District, Georgia Conference) met with 25 other preachers and laymen at Bethel Campground and organized and chartered the Mount Zion Seminary (serving students from first grade to college). Mount Zion was one of the first high schools in Georgia. The school began its operations on December 6, 1880. It is the oldest school in Carroll County in continuous operation. In 1974, the schools were divided into a high school and middle school under Leon Golden and an elementary school under Quentin Miles. The present Principals are, Tony Childers, Elementary and Cynthia Clanton, Middle/High Schools. The building for the present Middle/High School was built in 1976 and serves grades six through twelve.

Both before and long after the advent of motor vehicles, the blacksmith took care of all mechanical needs, metal work, wood work, and repair work. Some early blacksmiths were J.M. Ellison, Ellison and Albright, T.G. Harrell, and others.

Cotton gins in the Mt. Zion area were owned and operated by J.A. Enterkin (in

Mt. Zion, Cont'd.

Jake), Garrett (near Eureka Baptist Church), Mandeville (where the agent was W. T. Morris), Shaw (at Mt. Zion), and others. In later years, W. G. Entrekin was a real estate agent with offices in Bremen and Mt. Zion.

Transportation for passengers and freight began in 1910, when the Bowdon Railroad began services from Harmony (now Bowdon Junction) to Bowdon, passing through Mount Zion, Burwell and other places. The company built a station in Mt. Zion for the benefit of the Mt. Zion area citizens.

Mount Zion was settled in 1852 and was chartered as a town in 1910. The early city records were destroyed by a fire in the 1950's. The mayors since 1953 have been: Hicks Ashmore, T.H. Gammon, Gene Ashmore, Mary Ward, Jack Dorsey, Donald Newman, Clyde McWhorter, and John Griffin (present Mayor).

Since 1975, the city of Mt. Zion has grown by the hundreds in population. Improved services for the citizens have followed. The population in 1975 was 295. The present population is 1395. The city limits were one mile square. In 1975, Mt. Zion had a tiny city hall (using a building built in 1907) an antiquated water tank (built in 1918) with leaking water lines serving about 50 customers, one store, a post office, and a clothing factory.

Since 1975, the following improvements have been made: Lake J. Ebb Duncan has been built; sidewalks were laid; and a police department, fire department, recreation department, public library, and the Mt. Zion Primary Health Care Center have been organized and continue to serve the citizens of Mt. Zion. Additionally, the city now utilizes the positions of: a recreation director, a city manager, a city planner, a works director, and a librarian. Recreation fields have been built at Dillard Field and Katy Lane. The water distribution system has been rebuilt and expanded. The city limits have been extended. Property has been purchased to be utilized as a community center. All city streets have been marked. Street lights have been installed. Two bridges have been replaced. Ten new streets have been paved. An old cafe building has been remodeled to house the city recreation department. A new city hall has been built. The Mount Zion-Carrollton Road was turned into a state highway (GA 16). Finally, a new post office has been built.

Construction companies have been established by W.W. Robinson, Donald Dillard, Walker Earnest, Clyde McWhorter, and Donald Newman. Other businesses are a tax service, a recreation center, a hardware store, and a gun shop.

The West Georgia Regional Airport was founded over 30 years ago by the county commissioners of Haralson and Carroll Counties. It borders Mt. Zion on the east at Airport Road. West Central Technical College at Waco is located five miles from Mt. Zion and will help serve the needs of the area's population. A major state park (John Tanner State Park) is located near the city of Mt. Zion and helps to serve the recreation needs of Mt. Zion and the West Georgia area.

In the future, Mt. Zion wants to re-develop its downtown district, create a community transportation system, develop water treatment and sewage treatment systems, build a new community center, establish a branch bank, have rural mail delivery under the Mt. Zion name, expand the services of the Primary Health Care Center, and expand and improve the present library.

C and F, 1st Georgia Reserves (Fannin's). He enlisted in Co. F on the same day and deserted on 25 Aug 1864. He was caught or returned voluntarily and was reduced in rank from sergeant to private on 28 Aug 1864 for being AWOL. Jonah TYSON, relationship not proved, enlisted four days earlier on 26 Apr 1864 in Co. C, 1st Georgia Reserves (Fannin's). He was one of 202 guards who died at Andersonville. Was Jonah also a son of Josiah TYSON?
