

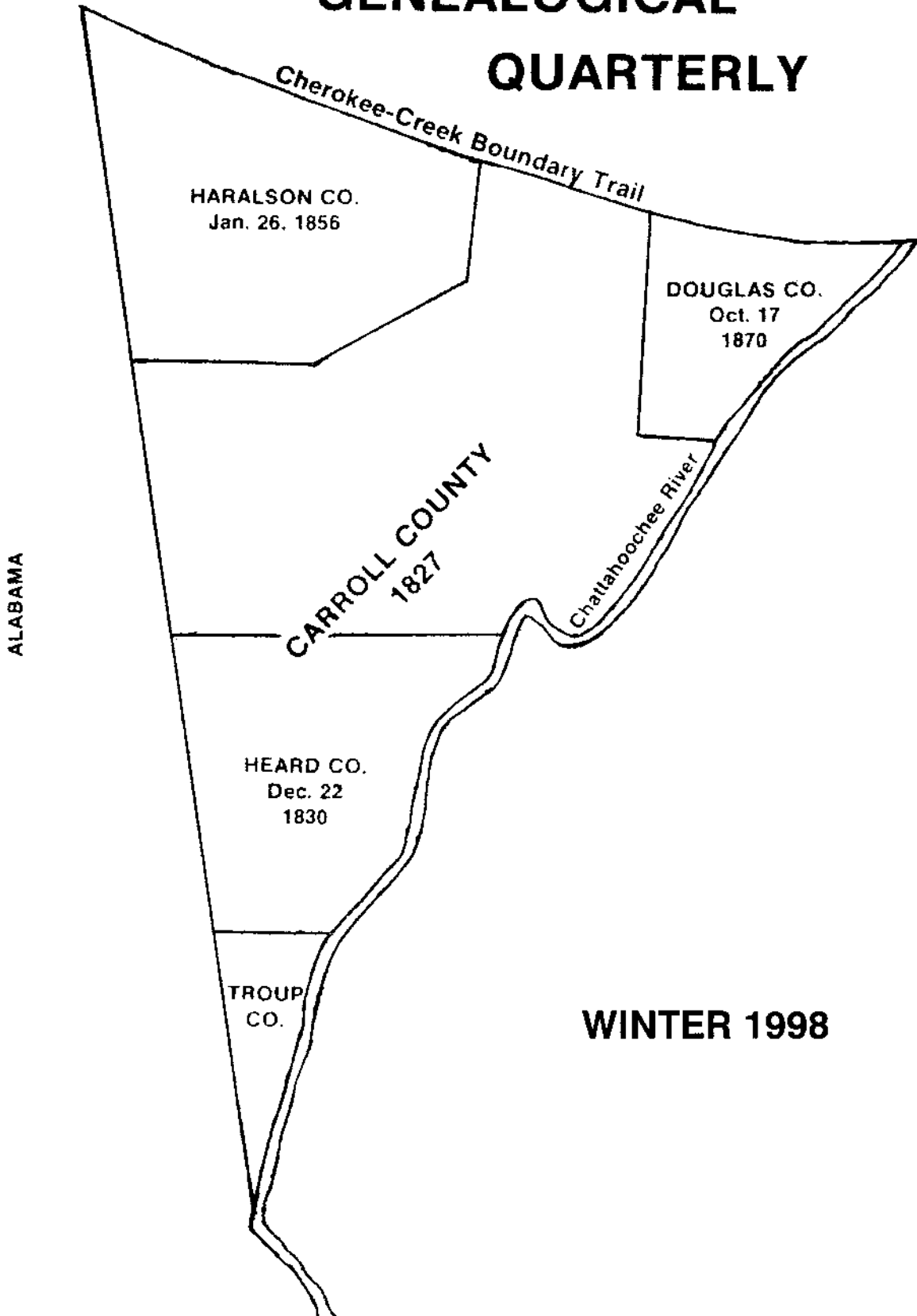

The following is from a book called "*Statistics of the State of Georgia*" By George White, published in 1849.

CARROLL COUNTY

BOUNDARIES , EXTENT -- The county has Paulding on the north, Campbell and Coweta on the east, Heard on the south, and Alabama on the west. Laid out in 1826, and a part added to Campbell in 1828, and a part to Heard in 1830. Length 26 miles, breadth 22, containing 572 square miles.

RIVERS, CREEKS -- The principal streams are the Chattahoochee, and Little Tallapoosa rivers, and Turkey, Yellow Dirt, Whooping and Snake creeks.

POPULATION, TAXES, REPRESENTATION -- In 1845 the population was 6,482 whites, 529 blacks. Total, 7,011. Amount of State tax returned for 1848, \$1,400.13. Sends one representative to the Legislature.

POST OFFICES -- Carrollton, Hickory Level, Laurel Hill, Rotherwood, Tallapoosa, Villa Rica, Burret Stand, Cerro Gordo.

EARLY SETTLERS -- Among the early settlers were Hinche P. Mabry, W. G. Springer, Joseph Chambers, John Robinson, and Giles S. Boggess.

MANUFACTURES, MILLS -- Bowen's factory on Snake creek, ten miles from Carrollton, recently established, five hundred spindles, but calculated for more. One wool card establishment near Carrollton. Several mills for pounding gold ore, nine saw-mills, ten grist-mills, one merchant mill, two distilleries.

RELIGIOUS SECTS, EDUCATION -- The Methodists and Baptists are the most numerous. Near Carrollton are a few Presbyterians. Sufficient attention is not given to the subject of education.

FACE OF THE COUNTRY, NATURE OF THE SOIL -- Several ridges run through the county. These ridges give origin to many springs. The soil is various. Some of the land is gray, and a large portion is productive red land. On the creeks the lands are fertile. The glades in this county might, under judicious management, be rendered productive.

PRODUCTIONS, AVERAGE PRODUCT PER ACRE, VALUE OF LAND -- Corn, wheat, rye, oats, barley, &c. The culture of cotton has been but recently commenced, and has proved successful. The staple is of a superior quality. Fruits, such as apples, pears, plums, and grapes, are very fine. Vegetables succeed well. The product of corn is from four to five barrels per acre. Wheat from seven to forty bushels per acre. Cotton about seven hundred pounds per acre. Improved lands are worth from four to five collars per acre. Wild lands sell low.

TOWNS -- Carrollton is the county seat, situated on an eminence upon the waters of Little Tallapoosa, 151 miles northwest of Milledgeville, 26 miles from Newnan, 24 from Franklin, 26 from Campbellton, 34 from Van Wert, 46 from Marietta. and 18 from Alabama. It has a court-house, jail, two academies, two hotels, and one church. Population 250. Incorporated in 1829.

Villa Rica is a pleasant village, situated in the centre of the gold region, on the ridge dividing the waters of the Tallapoosa and Sweet Water Creeks. It has one church, one hotel, two schools, masonic lodge, division of the Sons of Temperance. Population 200. Amount of business done in a year exceeds \$100,000. It was settled in 1830 by persons interested in the mining operations. It is a healthy village, and the character of the population has much improved. Distant from Carrollton 16 miles

northeast, 22 from Campbellton, 30 from Marietta, and from Cassville, Rome, Fayetteville, Franklin, Decatur, and Abacoochee Mine, in Alabama, 42 miles.

GOLD MINES, MINERALS -- Gold is abundant, and is said to be finer than any found in Georgia. Near Villa Rica there is an extent of country six miles long and one mile wide, in which there are numerous mines known as the "Carroll Mines." Many of them have proved to be profitable. The amount of gold obtained from these mines cannot be stated with accuracy. The general average is one pennyweight per hand.

West of Villa Rica 22 miles is a valuable mine, owned by Holland, Bonner, and others.

Bonner's mine, five miles southwest of Carrollton, is also very rich. Some iron is found; also mica, quartz, granite &c.

MINERAL SPRINGS -- In Villa Rica there is a spring slightly impregnated with sulphur, and in different parts of the county there are chalybeate springs.

CHARACTER OF THE PEOPLE -- In the early settlement of this county, many irregularities were committed; but the population at this time, in point of morality and good order, are equal to that of many of the older counties.

CLIMATE, DISEASES -- No country on earth has a more salubrious climate. The diseases are very few.

NAME -- This county is named after Charles Carroll. This venerable man, a signer of the Declaration of American Independence, was born at Annapolis, Sept. 8, 1737. When very young, he was sent to France to receive his education. He remained there until 1757, when he visited London, and commenced the study of the law. He returned to the United States in 1764, with a mind very highly cultivated. About this period, the respective rights of the colonies occupied much of the public attention; and among these who boldly advocated their rights was Mr. Carroll. In 1776 Mr. Carroll was appointed, in conjunction with four other distinguished gentleman, to visit Canada, and persuade the inhabitants to unite with the colonies in the cause of liberty; but various circumstances rendered his mission abortive. Mr. Carroll came to Philadelphia just as Congress was discussing the question of declaring the colonies free and independent. He was in favour of this; but the delegates from Maryland were instructed to vote against it. Mr. Carroll hearing this, left Philadelphia immediately for Annapolis, where the convention was then sitting, and succeeded by his efforts in inducing that body to give their delegates instructions to vote for independence. On the same day he was appointed a delegate to Congress. Mr. Carroll had not voted on this subject, not being a member of Congress at the time the votes were taken. Mr. Hancock asked him if he would sign it. Most willingly, he replied, and immediately affixed his name to that immortal document; upon which one of the members remarked, "There goes half a million at the dash of a pen." Mr. Carroll aided in the formation of the constitution of Maryland in 1776, and continued in Congress until 1778. In the Senate of Maryland he served for several years, and was a member of the United States Senate for a long period. In 1810 he quitted public life, and passed the remainder of his days in tranquility. He died at Baltimore, Nov. 14, 1832, in his 96th year.

**THE FAMILY OF
WILLIAM GABRIEL WARREN AND DREWRY MELVINA SILVEY**

William Gabriel Warren, born 10 Aug 1854 in Lowell, GA, was the son of Walter Tillman Warren and Mary Elizabeth Smith. Drewry Melvina Silvey, born 28 Apr 1863, was the daughter of William Drewry Silvey and Mary Hollan Pitts.

According to the Bible records (*Hitchcock's New and Complete Analysis of the Holy Bible*), William Gabriel Warren and Melvina Silvey were married 19 Aug 1879. This Concordance, believed to have been purchased about 1888, was originally owned by W. G. and Melvina Warren. After the death of Melvina Warren on 17 Apr 1950, it was passed to the youngest daughter, Mae Warren of Bowdon, Georgia, who still resides on some land that once belonged to her mother and father.

Melvina's father, William Drewry Silvey, died near the end of the Civil War. She, along with her brother and sister, was raised by her grandfather, Jessie B. Silvey. After the death of Jessie Silvey, Melvina inherited 60 acres of land. W. G. Warren inherited about ten acres from his father, Walter T. Warren, and then continued to buy more acreage from his brothers and sisters and friends whose property adjoined theirs. They first lived in a one-room house on Smithfield Road, after which they built a two-room house across the road. As the family grew, the Warrens continued to add more rooms to their original house. They farmed the accumulated 160 acres in spite of his poor health. Grandfather Warren was a semi-invalid after about age 25; he suffered with a severe case of what was known then as catarrh.

William Gabriel and Melvina were members of the Poplar Springs Primitive Baptist Church and both are buried there. Although my grandfather died well before I was born, I remember quite well attending the Annual Communion Service with my grandmother's family and observing the ritual of washing feet. As a child, I did not understand the meaning of the ritual. Nevertheless, I remember the solemnity of the service and how humble my grandmother was.

Some childhood memories remain forever. I never see a walkway bordered with blooming thrift or boxwoods standing tall on either side of steps leading to the open front porch that I don't see her sitting there, in the rocking chair, with a shawl worn loosely around her shoulders.

The following article was sent to us by Lee Wash. It came from the West Georgia National Bank and we have abstracted the following:

THE YEAR 2000 AND YOU

Large computer networks aren't the only systems at risk at the Year 2000 date change. If your desktop computer was manufactured before 1995, or if you use older database, spreadsheet, or accounting software, your system may also need to be checked.

If you are unsure about your computer hardware's readiness for the Year 2000, a program offered online by the National Software Testing Labs

www.nstl.com/downloads/y2000.exe

could help. It will test your computer clock's ability to advance to the year 2000 and handle leap years properly. You may also contact your software's publisher to see if the version you use is Year 2000 compliant.

Here's how to use the above program:

The above file downloads in the compressed form and has to be expanded before it can be used. It is a DOS program and has to be installed on your C: drive in the expanded form. If you are using Windows 95 go to Start, click on it and find Windows Explorer, get it up and find the Dir. in which you downloaded the y2000 program. Highlight it by left clicking the file 2000 once, then right click it once which will bring up a window giving you a number of options, click on copy. Go over to the left-hand column and highlight the C: drive by clicking it once, then right click it once and it will bring up a window, select the option paste. Find the file y2000, click on it and it will bring up the program. Accept the licensing agreement by typing "Y" and it should bring up the program running. It will tell you what it is doing and if your computer is compatible with the year 2000 and also Leap Year.

SHACKELFORD RESEARCH

Let me introduce myself. I am Donnie R. Shackelford from Montgomery, Alabama. NOTE: The spelling of my last name; it should be spelled "SHACKELFORD." For reasons unknown to me, the name was changed at the early part of this century. This has made tracking my ancestors very difficult. Up until a couple of weeks ago, I knew only the name of my grandfather and nothing else and, at 46 years of age, I decided it was time to find some family history. So please, let me share with you what I have found. You have to remember that at the beginning of this research I knew basically nothing.

My father was Iry Zeddie Shackelford (el). He passed away on 04 Dec 1988. Before his death I could hardly ever get him to share with me any knowledge of his family history. Dad was born in Oct 1907 in Petrey, Alabama, and had one sister living; her name was Vera. There were seven other children; all died at birth or shortly thereafter. This I didn't know until a week ago. I have since located their gravesites, along with my grandparents. All are buried in Petrey, Alabama, except two who are buried at Cameron's Chapel, Crenshaw Co., Alabama.

My grandfather was Young Lee Shackelford, who died in 1926 at the age of 44. He was born in Carroll Co., Georgia, in 1882. I found out that for some reason he ran away from home in 1896 and came to Alabama. It wasn't until many years later that his mother and grandmother found him, only after he had married and had children. He refused to go back and, as far as I know, never spoke to them again. After his death in 1926, my father, his sister, and his mother went back to Georgia to live with his grandmother for a couple of years, then returned to Crenshaw Co., Alabama, where he met my mother. The next contact he had with his family was in 1948 and only for one afternoon. This contact was made with his first cousin, Robert Shackelford of Carrollton, Georgia.

My grandfather, Young Lee, had some brothers and sisters. I have found only one name, John Gaye Shackelford of Carroll Co., Georgia. I don't know his birth or death dates, but suspect his birth would have been in the 1880s. John Gaye had several children, but the only names I found were Robert and John. I know nothing of John's offspring but I have found Robert's line. Robert had several children, and I believe he had four boys and two girls. The boys are Lee, Wayne, Jerry, and Harlin. I found Lee in Carrollton last week. This was the first contact they had with our side of the Shackelfords since the one afternoon in 1948, four years before my birth. I need not tell you how excited I have become. Wayne Shackelford is now the DOT Commissioner for the State of Georgia. I am working on contacting the other two boys and their sisters.

I have come a long way in such a very short time but there are many stones left unturned. This is where I hope you can help. If you have any idea of who Young Lee's and John Gaye Shackelford's father and mother are, I feel I can trace my roots back to the beginning. Even if you have any information on any Shackelfords from Georgia, it would most likely help. I can be reached at doncon402@yahoo.com. Thank you so much for your time.

Mrs. Denney writes:

We received information from Bradley Reaves (copy of 1850 & 1860 Troup Co., Ga. census, copy of marriage record from Elbert Co., Ga., copy of marriage license, etc.) concerning the parents of James A. Denney. Too late for this book and too important to overlook!

We wanted a little more information about Martha Angeline (Mary Ann) Patterson. And at the Troup County Historical Society - Archives, LaGrange, Ga., we found on the 1850 Troup County census "**Martha A. Patterson**," age 14, living with her parents, **John Patterson** (age 35, b. abt. 1815) and **Mary** (age 30, b. abt. 1820) with brothers: Thomas J. (12), John W. (10), James D. (8), William N. (6), and sisters: Caroline V. (4), and Nancy M. (1). In addition to the above, the Grandfather John Patterson, Sr., was living in the same household. He was 83 which means he was born about 1767. The census record shows all the household members were born in Georgia except John Sr. and he was born in South Carolina.

In 1840, according to the Troup County, Ga. census David Denney's household consisted of 6 white males and 5 white females with **no slaves**. No details are furnished.

The 1850 census shows two Denney households. Allen F. Denney (27) is shown as head of household with **David (65)**, Stephen (25), William (21), and **James (18)** Margaret (38, Nancy (23), and Mary A. (17) - in that order. Allen, David, Stephen and William have "planter" listed as their occupation. James is shown as a farmhand. They were all born in Georgia and Allen had property valued at \$200.

The second household has Washington Denney (37) listed as head with Jane (21), Mary Jane (3), Juliana (6 mo.) and Jane Thompson (42). Washington had property valued at \$200. They all were born in Georgia except wife Jane, who was born in Florida and Jane Thompson from South Carolina, and he owned **1 slave**.

The 1860 census shows 4 Denney households:

2. **James** (28) farmer with **A.** (19) f, Frank (6), John (3) and Cullie (5 mo.) - Cullie was listed as John on the census - there were two Johns. All born in Georgia.

4. **William** (32) farmer with real estate \$500, N. (35) f, Thomas (7), B. (6), B. (4), **D. (3)**, and T. (1 mo.). All born in Georgia.

David is not shown in the 1860 Troup County, Georgia census.

A SHARPE FAMILY

Members of the Sharpe Family are found in several areas of the United States. Rev. John Sharpe traveled East Jersey tending the religious needs of the families in that area. Large families were baptised by him on the same date in early 1700, because no ministers were available in the new country when the children were born. By the late 1700s, members of the Sharpe Family had moved into North Carolina. Members of these families are found in most of the southern states.

The first members of the Sharpe Family to arrive in America came in the ill-fated "*Virginia Merchant*," bound for Jamestown and loaded with many emigrants. In January 1650, the ship was driven by a storm and foundered among the islands of the Chincoteague Bay on the Atlantic coast of Maryland and Virginia. Upon one of these islands, adjacent to what is now Somerset and Worcester Counties, Col. Norwood, Francis Morryson, Williams Stevens, and perhaps William Sharpe, landed and from there found their way by use of a guide to the home of Argall Yardley, and later to the plantation of Col. Littleton, in Accomac County, Virginia.

Thomas Sharpe died in Cecil Co., Maryland. His widow and children came to Mecklenburg Co., North Carolina, and settled.

Hon. William Sharpe, son of Thomas and Jamimah, and #1 in the preceding paragraph, was born 13 Dec 1742 in Cecil Co., Maryland. In 1779 he was a member of the Continental Congress from North Carolina. He and his sons took a leading part in the American Revolution. His wife was Ruth Reese, daughter of David Reese the signer and Ruth Polk, of the Polk family of Somerset Co., Maryland, and Mecklenburg Co., North Carolina. Hon. William Sharpe died in 1818, at the age of 77 years, leaving a widow and twelve children.

Col. William Stevens and William Sharpe later settled on Pocomoke River and Dividing Creek in Somerset where through several generations they and their descendants were neighbors of the Caldwells, Polks, and Alexanders. Col. William Stevens addressed a letter to the Presbytery of Lagan in Ireland asking for young ministers to be sent to Virginia. This resulted in the coming of Rev. Francis Mackkie, John Henry, John Hampton, and John Thomas.

William Sharp, the neighbor of Col. Stevens, was the father of Dr. Peter Sharpe, whose will was proven in Calvert County, 28 May 1672. Peter left to his son, William Sharpe, and his heirs certain lands and properties of his estate in Talbot County on Tuckahoe Creek. From Talbot County, the Sharps and Alexanders pushed north across the Sassafras River to the fork of the Elk, and the fork of the Bohomia River into Cecil County, Maryland. Thomas Sharpe died in Cecil County in 1749. He named the following children in his will: William, Thomas, James, Hannah, Sarah, Joseph, and Samuel Sharpe. Sons-in-law James Smith and David Wherry were mentioned in the will.

At a sale of the personal effects of the late Wilson Stallings on last Saturday, a pair of dog irons were sold, which were said to be 102 years old. They had been in the family of Mr. Stallings 42 years.

She had been in feeble health for some time, but her death was also unexpected at this time. The remains of Mrs. A. were carried to Heard county for burial.

BRYCE/BRICE, ORR.

William and Mary Orr BRYCE/BRICE arrived in this country ca 1799. They brought two children with them, Mary and Elizabeth, and two children, Agnes and Thomas, remained in Scotland. They settled in Union District (now Columbia), SC, and had either eight or nine more children. About 1825 they were in DeKalb Co., GA, and were two of eight co-founders of the Decatur Presbyterian Church. In 1827 they were in Carroll Co., and William was a member of the Grand Jury for the First Court. "Carroll County and Her People," by Private Joe Cobb, states that a son, James BRYCE, was one of the early white settlers in the County. William BRYCE is mentioned in the book "Georgia's Last Frontier," by James C. Bonner, as being appointed a commissioner for the town of Carrollton on 22 Dec 1829.
